Directions: Laurelville Retreat Center is located about 40 miles southeast of Pittsburgh, at the foot of the Laurel Mountains of southwestern Pennsylvania.

Coming from the West via Turnpike Exit the Pennsylvania Turnpike at New Stanton (exit 75). Take Rt. 119 South to the Rt. 31 exit. Turn left and follow Rt. 31 East through Mt. Pleasant, to the village of Laurelville at the intersection of Rt. 982. Turn on to Rt. 982 North. The Center is 3/4 mile north of the intersection, 1/4 mile off Rt. 982. Watch for Laurelville signs.

Coming from the West via I-70 Coming from I-70, take Rt. 119 South to the Rt. 31 exit. Turn left (east) and go through Mt. Pleasant to the village of Laurelville at the intersection of Rt. 982. Turn on to Rt. 982 North (left). The Center is 3/4 mile north of the intersection, 1/4 mile off Rt. 982. Watch for Laurelville signs.

Coming from the East via Turnpike Exit the Pennsylvania Turnpike at Donegal (exit 91). Take Rt. 31 West (right turn) to the village of Laurelville. Turn on to Rt. 982 North. The Center is 3/4 mile north of the intersection, 1/4 mile off Rt. 982. Watch for signs.

Check in time is 5:00 p.m. on the 10th. Evening sessions will begin at 7:00 p.m. and morning sessions will be held at 10:00 a.m.

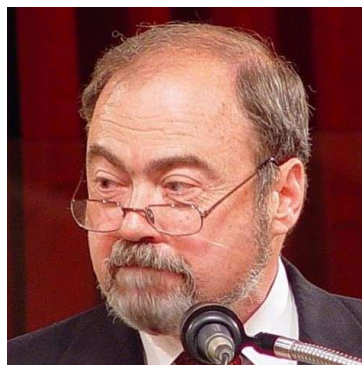

2023 Conference Speakers:

Pastor Mark Webb



Mark was raised on a cotton farm in Texas before heading to Rice University to pursue a career in Math/Physics. While there the Lord called him out of the science world to a life of pastoral ministry. He pastored first in Evanston, Wyoming, then helped begin a new church in Nashville, Tennessee, before moving to the Memphis area. There he would pastor Grace Bible Church, in Olive Branch, Mississippi, for 30 years before retiring in 2018. Besides pastoring, he has been active in speaking in Bible conferences in the U.S. and Canada. He's also been involved in teaching at the Mexican-Indian Training Center in Cordoba, Mexico for over 25 years. He and his wife, Paula, currently split their time between Olive Branch, Mississippi and their ranch in Webb Canyon, outside of Hartville, Wyoming.

Pastor Jason McClanahan



Jason grew up near Charleston and he attended college at West Virginia State. In May 1997, he received his Bachelor of Science degree in Social Work at WVSU. During his sophomore year, Jason met his future wife, Ginger. She was instrumental in leading him to Christ through her life and love for the Savior. In June 1994, God radically changed Jason's heart and he placed his faith in Christ. From that day, Jason began pursuing pastoral ministry. Upon completion of the undergraduate degree, he completed a three year Master of Divinity degree at Virginia Beach Theological Seminary. In 2008, he likewise completed the Doctor of Ministry in Expository Preaching from Master's Seminary in Los Angeles. Prior to serving at Randolph Street, Jason planted and pastored Providence Baptist Church in Columbus, Ohio for seven years. Jason and Ginger married in September 1995 and have three children.
